RE: CONSTRUCTION OF NOISE WALL 7C ADJACENT TO YOUR PROPERTY


Dear Property Owner:

The Windsor Essex Mobility Group and Parkway Infrastructure Constructors in consultation with the Ontario Ministry of Transportation is proceeding with the detail design and construction of noise wall 7C along Huron Church Road, adjacent to Daytona Avenue from Pulford Street north towards Grand Marais Road.

The Plan

The following work will take place:

- A noise wall will be installed adjacent to your property along Huron Church Road approximately 0.75 metres away from the property line on the highway right-of-way.
- The new noise wall will be 5.0 metres in height.
- The noise wall colour is yellow-brown in a natural stone pattern with colour-matched posts (see photos below).
- The wooden fence currently installed on the back of your property will be removed once the new noise wall has been installed.
- Following the installation of the new noise wall and the removal of the current wooden fence, the existing wooden fences that run perpendicular to the noise barrier will be extended to close the 0.75 metre gaps between the new noise barrier and the existing perpendicular fences.

Permission to Enter

As stated in the purchase agreement between the Ministry of Transportation and yourself, access to your property will be required on one or more occasions during the development of the design for the new noise wall and during construction. Specifically, we will require access to your property to complete the following activities:

- During Design:
 - o Collection of field data via observations and photographs of the existing wooden fence, property fences, landscaping and vegetation. This work is essential in order to develop the restoration options for the interior side of the new noise wall.
- During Construction:
 - o Clearing of existing vegetation on the highway right-of-way adjacent to existing fence.
 - o Construction of the new noise wall on the highway right-of-way adjacent to your property.
 - o Removal of the privacy wooden fence on the back of your property.
 - o Restoration of areas affected during construction and extension of existing fences between properties as required.

Property Maintenance

For a 30 year period after completion of construction of the Rt. Hon. Herb Gray Parkway, the Windsor Essex Mobility Group is responsible for maintaining the new noise wall, including both sides, the highway and the residential one. Beyond the 30 year period, maintenance will continue to rest with the Province.

The new noise wall is MTO's property; therefore, please be advised that nothing can be affixed to it.

The maintenance of the lateral fences (including the new extension) and the extra 0.75 metres in your backyard will be your responsibility.
