Construction Update

If you have driven through the construction corridor lately you would notice many completed permanent features of the Parkway. The Parkway team looks forward to a busy summer with lots of work going on through the corridor. If you have any comments, questions or concerns about Parkway construction, please contact the Public Liaison Office at 1-877-937-5929.

Here is some of the work that will be taking place over the summer months:

- Surface work on Highway 3 between Bridge 9 (between Cabana Road west and Geraedts Drive) and the Oliver Estates Tunnel (Tunnel 11)
- Roadway works for Highway 401 between Bridge 3 (Eastbound E.C. Row Expressway Overpass) and the Labelle Tunnel (Tunnel 2); for Highway 401 from the Geraedts Tunnel (Tunnel 8) to Bridge 13 (future off-ramp from Highway 401 westbound to Highway 3); for Highway 401 westbound from the North Talbot Road Bridge (Bridge 15) to Bridge 14 (realigned Howard Avenue); for Todd Lane and Huron Church Line
- Reconstruction of Howard Avenue (north and south intersection); construction of Bridge 12 (Howard Avenue Bridge); ongoing works on the pedestrian tunnel at Howard Avenue
- Placing the deck on the Villa Borghese Tunnel (Tunnel 7) and placing girders at the Labelle Tunnel (Tunnel 2).

- A. I work to facilitate the flow of documents/drawings between the

individual departments (Quality, Construction, Tech Services etc.) and all our subcontractors, as well as between Parkway Infrastructure Constructors and our clients (Windsor Essex Mobility Group, Ministry of Transportation, Infrastructure Ontario).

- Q. How long have you been working on the project?
- A. In June, I will celebrate my third anniversary of working on the Parkway.
- Q. When people find out that you are working on the Parkway project what do they typically say?

#What's a #hashtag?

The Rt. Hon. Herb Gray Parkway is on social media and uses the hashtag to help track comments and respond as needed to the public. Hashtags are vital to the way we communicate online, and it's important to know how to use them. When you enhance conversations. content, and updates with hashtags, they become more detectable to others on social media. Hashtags are a way to group conversations together; they can also be valuable when it comes to introducing information into other conversations.

On Twitter, the pound sign (#) turns any word or group of words that directly follow it into a searchable link. This allows you to organize content and track discussion topics based on that specific keyword. They also make it easier to track the comments by solely clicking on the hashtag. An easy click or search for a hashtag will display those using that hashtag in conversation while immediately identifying an audience with shared interests. The potential for using the hashtag is infinite and can be leveraged across platforms, or uniquely on each social platform. While hashtags were originally used by Twitter, it is great to see hashtag usage expanding to other social media outlets like Facebook, Pinterest and LinkedIn.

The hashtag used when talking about the Parkway on social media is #hgparkway. Start using it in your discussions today. We would love to see and learn more about the conversations being held about the Parkway.

Have your say DCR #8 available for review

On Saturday, June 14, 2014, the Parkway team released the eighth and final Design and Construction Report (DCR) for a 30-day public review period.

DCR #8 for the Rt. Hon. Herb Gray Parkway documents the design process and mitigation measures associated with Landscape Plan elements in the corridor, how public input received to date has influenced the design and how commitments outlined in the Detroit River International Crossing Provincial Environmental Assessment Report (December 2008) and the associated Conditions of Approval (August 2009) have been addressed.

DCR #8 covers a number of Parkway construction works including:


- the final Landscape Plan
- urban design and aesthetic elements
- the series of tunnels and tunnel tops connecting communities as well as a tunnel specifically designed for an eco-passage
- trail locations, community connections, and trail heads including plans for linkage to the Chrysler Greenway Trail (part of the Trans Canada Trail network) at the Howard Avenue commuter parking lot
- approaches to minor and major public art
- implementation of landscape types
- the final Wetland Compensation Plan and Fisheries Compensation Plan
- berms including the Ojibway Berm
- traffic management plans for short-term closures in the areas of Spring Garden Road/ Bethlehem Avenue and Howard Avenue.

The DCR is available online at www.hgparkway.ca and at various public offices in the community. Comments can be submitted until July 14 at 3:00 p.m.

Traffic Notes

Here are some upcoming traffic items that are anticipated to take place this summer: **Bethlehem Avenue** – To excavate the Highway 401 portion in this area, the Parkway team will need to close Bethlehem Avenue where it currently meets Highway 3.

Matchette Road – To place girders for the Matchette Road overpass (Bridge 2), the Parkway team will need to close Matchette Road over the course of a weekend.

The following traffic shifts and closures are currently in place within the Parkway corridor:

Howard Avenue north of Highway 3 – Howard Avenue north of Highway 3 closed for approximately one month starting June 6. This closure is required to complete reconstruction of the intersection of Howard Avenue and Highway 3 as part of the Parkway. The closure is limited to the area directly north of the Highway 3 intersection and does not impact local residents accessing homes on Howard Avenue north of Highway 3. Local traffic accessing the Southwood Lakes subdivision is also able to travel via Howard Avenue to Havens Drive. The closure of Howard Avenue south of Highway 3 continues as well.

Highway 401 traffic shifted into the Roundabout – Highway 401 traffic (eastbound and westbound) approaching the intersection of Highway 3 and Howard Avenue has been temporarily shifted into the Parkway multi-lane roundabout. This traffic shift is required to construct the final configuration for Highway 401 and Highway 3 at the east end of the Parkway corridor and will be in place until the end of the year.
