Construction Notification

You will be notified of specific construction activities, including local road closures and lane restrictions, that may impact those residing, doing business or travelling through the Parkway corridor by:

- mail drops and letters to neighbours
- notification on www.weparkway.ca and through Twitter
- signage
- media reports
- community and business group meetings.

Signage

Signage will be used to inform the community of local road closure and lane restrictions. Signs will be erected before construction begins to ensure the travelling public and the community are aware of future traffic impacts.

In keeping with the Detroit River International Crossing Notice of Approval, the Windsor Essex Mobility Group will have a protocol for dealing with and responding to inquiries received during construction of the Windsor-Essex Parkway. The Senior Public Liaison Officer will be the initial contact for any type of public inquiry or complaint. All efforts will be made to resolve complaints in a timely manner.
