


Temporary Closure of Cousineau Road at Highway 3 and Opening of Diversion 14

Cousineau Closure

As part of construction for the Cousineau Tunnel (T-9), which will be a permanent feature of the completed Windsor-Essex Parkway, the intersection of Cousineau Road and Highway 3 will be closed for approximately one year.

Detour Routes


During this closure, travellers are being directed to use Howard Ave, Dougall Ave, Cabana Road West and Highway 3 (Talbot Road) as alternate routes to access Cousineau Road.



Diversion 14 – Sandwich West Parkway

To accommodate traffic in this area, vehicular and pedestrian access to Sandwich West Parkway will be maintained through the use of a diversion road (Diversion 14 or D-14) which includes a new signalized intersection. This closure is in effect starting Monday, November 26, 2012.

Diversion 14 connecting Sandwich West Parkway to Highway 3 is the result of public and stakeholder consultation. Once the Windsor-Essex Parkway is completed, access to Cousineau Road will be restored.



Pedestrian Access

A sidewalk for pedestrian use has been incorporated into the diversion design and will provide direct access from Sandwich West Parkway to Cousineau Road. Due to the extent of excavation in this area for T-9, pedestrian access in this alignment will last until approximately spring 2013. Once the excavation of T-9 begins, direct pedestrian access to Cousineau Road will no longer be possible. We will provide the public with additional details at that time related to pedestrian access.
